To be held at Elvaston Village Hall

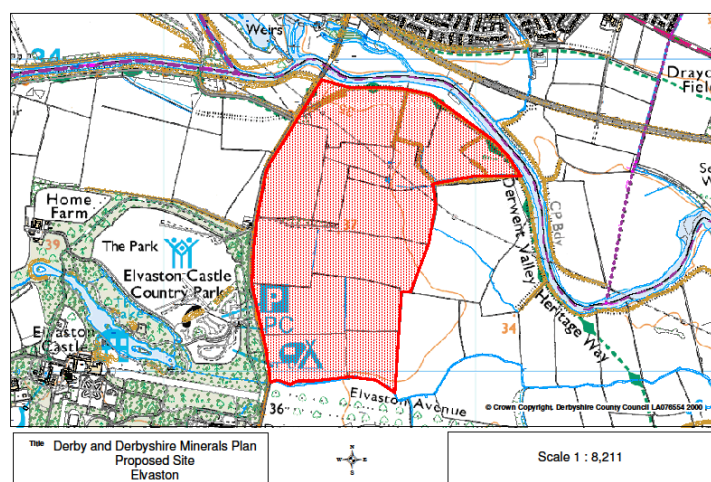
Friday 5<sup>th</sup> October from 12.00 noon to 7.00pm

Derbyshire County and Derby City Councils together are preparing a Minerals Plan for the area. This document will set out a broad vision and strategy for minerals development in Derby and Derbyshire to 2030 and provide the framework against which planning applications for mineral development will be judged. Importantly, it will also show sites from where minerals will be supplied.

A number of sites have been put forward by mineral operators for future sand and gravel extraction, one of which lies in this parish (shown on the map below). All sites put forward must now be assessed to determine whether they will be included in the plan.

Representatives from the Councils will be at the Parish Hall on Friday 5th October from 12 noon to 7.00pm to explain the plan in more detail and to answer any questions. Your input will be vital to the development of this plan. Please drop in whenever you want between these times for a chat about the plan.
