How to join

- If you live, work or study in Derbyshire you can join at any library. It is FREE to do so and you can join at any age. You can apply to join online at www.derbyshire.gov.uk/libraries
- Adults and children aged 12 and over need to bring in a piece of identification which shows your name and address
- Children under 12 need to be registered at our libraries by a parent or carer. If you're registering a child, please bring your own item of identification with you
- You will be given a library card with a unique number. Bring it along every time you come to the library. You'll also need it to access our 24 hour library.



b_line and Gold Card holders

When you get a b_line or Gold Card you automatically become a member of our library service. All you have to do is activate your b_line or Gold Card at any Derbyshire County Council library.
