

# **Leaving Hospital Information Sheet**

### Coming out of hospital

Hospital discharges are conducted in accordance with the Care Act 2014. The hospital staff will tell us if you need an assessment of your care needs to start or continue with care services on your return home.

### **Acute hospital discharges**

Once the hospital has contacted us, we then have between 3 and 5 days to complete an assessment of what social care eligible needs you may have and whether a package of care is required in line with the Care Act. This process also applies to those who may need residential or nursing care and would meet the criteria for local authority funding.

## **Community hospital discharges**

Sometimes you may be admitted to a local, community hospital or residential care home rather than an acute hospital. You may also be transferred to a community hospital or care home for rehabilitation following an acute hospital stay.

#### **Interim arrangements**

On occasion it may be necessary for you to be given temporary support to continue your recuperation. This can be in your own home or a short stay in a care home. We also provide short term services that can give you support in your own home to regain lost skills and independence.

#### Intermediate care

Intermediate care is a service provided to help you recover from illness sooner. It involves a range of professionals including occupational therapists, social workers, physiotherapy and nursing staff working closely together.

Intermediate care is available to all adults over 18. It can be accessed via a referral from your GP or another social care or health professional. You can self-refer, or have a referral made on your behalf by a carer or family member, by contacting Call Derbyshire, tel: **01629 533 190**.

All referrals will be assessed using the intermediate care eligibility criteria. In general you need: to be medically stable and supported by your GP in the community

to be able to benefit from time-limited rehabilitation in order to improve your level of independence consent - if the referral is made by a professional or your carer, they need to have your consent

If it's considered that you're not suitable for intermediate care, you'll be given the reasons for the decision. You may also be given details of more appropriate services.

# Derbyshire home from hospital support service

The Derbyshire Home from Hospital Service provides practical support for vulnerable people leaving hospital, or those living at home but at risk of being admitted for up to 6 weeks.

You can use the short-term service if you live in Derbyshire and need more support than is available from family or friends.

The Home from Hospital service is provided by a combination of staff and volunteers from the South Derbyshire community voluntary services (CVS) group. The service can provide the following types of support for up to a maximum of 6 weeks:

- fetching shopping and ensuring you have a plan in place to manage shopping after the service ends making sure your home environment is warm and comfortable
- arranging for key safes to be fitted and community alarm or telecare systems to be provided, if needed
- supporting you to pay bills and make appointments
- collecting medication prescriptions
- supporting you to maintain and improve your social networks
- supporting you to understand care options and plan future support
- signposting to other statutory, voluntary sector and community organisations

At the end of the 6-week period, you will either:

- be able to manage day to day tasks independently, or with the same or a decreased level of support you had before your hospital admission
- choose to continue to have ongoing support from other universal services
- have been assessed by adult social care for an ongoing care package
